Natives here called the loon *medawisla*, the great northern diver. Theirs is the wail-cry we equate with the wild.

Nestled at the shore of a secluded pond in the mountains east of Moosehead lake, Medawisla Wilderness Camps offers a chance to relax and enjoy the peace and solitude of the north woods.

Whether paddling the pond, watching wildlife, casting flies, hiking the trails, or simply relaxing at camp, Medawisla offers a special place to unwind. *Second Roach Pond*

ACTIVITIES

There are many routes to relaxation at Medawisla. Second Roach Pond offers a thousand acres for paddling, swimming, fishing, or just taking in the solitude. Boats and canoes can be rented.

Photographers enjoy endless opportunities for scenic and wildlife shots. Anglers enjoy fishing for landlocked salmon and brook trout. Moosehead Lake, the Roach River, and the West Branch of the Penobscot make for an easy day's fishing trip.

Lots of good hiking trails are nearby, including the Appalachian trail. And there's nothing wrong with simply kicking back at camp for the afternoon with a book chosen from your cabin's well-stocked library.



ACCOMMODATIONS

Handsome housekeeping cabins with knotty-pine interiors have full baths with hot water, showers, and flush toilets. The cabins can handle 2-10 persons and can be arranged for families, couples, or individuals.

Cabins overlook the river outlet end of the pond and are fully furnished with gas stoves, lights, refrigerators, double and twin beds, linens, dishes, and cooking utensils. Each cabin is equipped with a woodstove. Electricity is available from dusk until 9:30 p.m.

While fully-equipped kitchens remain available in winter, we also serve family-style meals at the lodge.

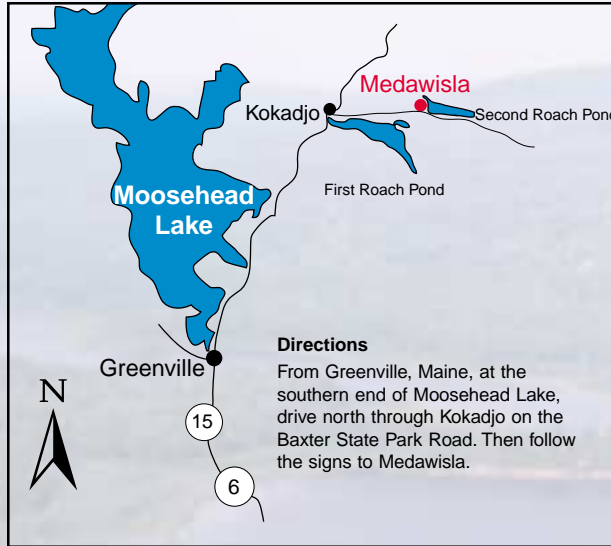
Dog sled trips are run by Steve Madera (Song In The Woods) and his twelve canine companions.

Moose often feed in the river at dawn and dusk; eagles, osprey, herons, and countless other birds fly overhead; beaver, river otter, white-tail deer, coyote and bear call the area home.
